In February, we were able to advise, help and send 8 children home. Every day, our employees worked in the streets, inviting children to the center - to change their lives. We also worked with their families. Many families need counseling, moral and material assistance. We try to support them with products and the bare necessities (mattresses, school uniforms, beds, sometimes we pay for tuition, etc.).





Austin Vamalwa couldn't get used to school. Constant problems with teachers pushed the boy to run away and completely discouraged him from learning. During a visit home, his father was advised to send his son to a boarding school, away from the city, so that there would be no such temptations. The father can afford it, so he agreed with us and paid for everything. We helped with the purchase of all the necessary things and, having agreed with the school, took Austin there. The kid is very happy.

Please pray for little Toby. Our social worker was trying to find at least someone

who could recognize the boy; checked to see if anyone had reported the child as missing. All to no avail. Toby still doesn't say anything about his family. It seems that there's no chance of finding his relatives. But we believe that nothing is impossible for God.



We visited our kids in the village of Jamanur (not far from Kitale). A while back



we helped these children with their uniform. Now our social worker has checked that the boys have gone to school. To our delight, all 10 of them did, and they're doing just fine. The school only asked for help with lunch, because most of the local parents can't pay for food.

His family is very poor, and the children sleep in dirty rags on the floor. The boy didn't go to school because his parents couldn't afford it. We bought a bed and mattresses for the children, paid for lunch at school and bought them food at home. Solomon and his parents were very grateful and happy.





Little Simon and Johnny went to prep school. Thank God for the hearts of people

disposed to support our children. Now the brothers have gone to a

regular school, and in time we plan to send them to a boarding school, because there's no way to live at home all the time because of their father. On vacation, they can stay at their aunts', who've agreed to temporarily accept the boys.

Every month we face new challenges, difficulties and issues, and sometimes it seems impossible to solve them. But each time God reminds us how great He is and decides everything in unexpected

ways. We are so grateful to everyone for their prayers and support and ask you to continue praying for our boys and for us. We also thank those whom God disposes to donate and help us financially.
